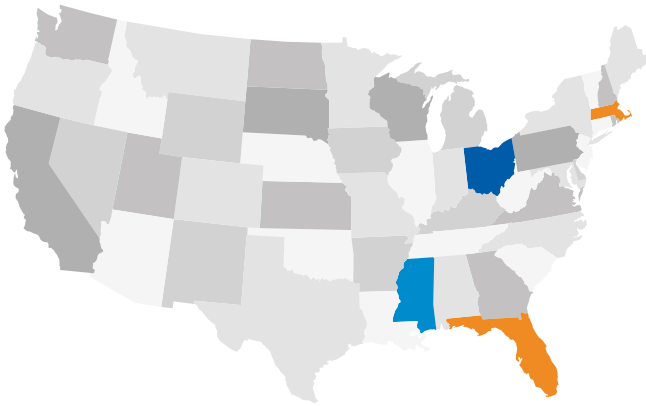




Transforming Education in the Face of a Crisis
